


# Seven Sacred Teachings

## **Report Cards**

We are pleased to provide regular reports on student progress.

Report cards are issued at the end of each school term. Term 1 report cards will be issued electronically Tuesday, November 21st via EduPost. Parent teacher conferences will be held inperson by appointment only.

Appointments will be held the evening of Thursday, November 23rd between the hours of 5:30 pm – 7:30 pm. and the morning of Friday November 24th between the hours of 9:30 am – 11:30 am.

## **Lost & Found**

We seem to have a lot of clothing left behind daily that finds it way into our lost & found. We highly encourage labeling your child's clothes as it makes it easier for us to find the owners.

Mrs. Keizer will periodically post pictures on our Facebook of our lost & found. Any unclaimed clothing will be donated.

### **Code Black**

Each year, schools are required to complete practice drills for Emergency Management, such as fire drills and lockdowns. They also have to complete a Code Black, which is evacuation and relocation. Should there be a scenario that requires us to evacuate the school, all students and staff will leave and walk to our relocation place, of 788 Shore Road. All families would be then contacted and we would dismiss from there.

These drills are in a three year cycle. Year one is table top (discussion), year two is small group relocation and year three is a full relocation practice. We are in the second year of the cycle and grade five is practicing this year.

## **Inclement Weather**

Occasionally, weather conditions can impact school bus service and school operations – especially in the winter. When it is stormy or road conditions are poor, CCRCE's Transportation Services staff starts the day before 6:00 a.m. by:

- Reviewing weather forecasts from different sources, for various areas within the four families of schools.
- Talking with the local Department of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal depots.
- Talking with bus drivers from various communities throughout the region.
- Driving on sections of roads.

Based on the forecast, actual weather and road conditions in each area, CCRCE has the following choices:

- Maintain bus and school operations as usual.
- Maintain bus services on paved roads only, or cancel bus services.
- Close schools.
- Delay opening schools by two hours. For example:
- If your school day normally starts at 8:30am, it will start 2 hours later at 10:30am.
- If your morning bus stop is usually 7:30am, it will be 9:30am.
- School dismissal times remain the same.

As our region is geographically large, separate cancellation and closure decisions are made for each of the four families of schools.

When it is stormy or road conditions are poor, make sure to check if school is open and busses are running before you send your children to the bus stop or bring them to school.

The best way to find out closure information is:

- Monitor your local radio or television stations
- Visit the CCRCE website
- Check out CCRCE's Twitter feed and Facebook page.
- Sign up for CCRCE's inclement weather text notifications below

CCRCE makes every effort to contact local media by 6:30 a.m. to make the appropriate announcements, as well as to post the information to our website and social media pages.

Closure and cancellation notices are sent to:

- All local radio and television stations within CCRCE.
- CBC radio in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island.
- CFCY radio in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island.

We ask that parents, guardians and students avoid calling schools on storm days, whenever possible.

#### **School Closures During The Day**

CCRCE rarely cancels school mid-day due to weather or road conditions. However, there may be other factors, such as power outages, that may result in a school closing unexpectedly during the day.

In the case that school closes early, CCRCE recommends parents and guardians keep their contact information up-to-date with schools and have alternate arrangements in place for their children.

Should a mid-day closure occur, parents/guardians will be notified either directly (in the case of elementary schools), via local media, our website and social media.

# **CCRCE Late Bussing Information**

CCRCE will be sharing late bus information with families through text notification.

Once families have opted in to receive text messages from their school, you will automatically receive text messages if a bus is running 20 minutes late or more from your school. To receive texts, please verify your contact information is up to date in PowerSchool and opt-in with our service provider by texting Y to the shortcode 978338.

You can also see information on cancelled buses and bus runs with significant delays on the <u>Late Bus</u>
<u>Notification</u> page.
